Parents: This form is to make sure that your scout gets their correct medicine at the correct time while they are at a scout event.

- All scouts under the age of 18 years old must turn in all prescription and over-the-counter medications to the on-duty Medic.
- The only exceptions are rescue inhalers and epi pens. Talk to the on-duty Medic at the event if you have any questions.

Instructions:

- Put Scouts name at the top.
- List each medication and then put a "X" with the number of pills (X1, X2, etc) to be taken at the time of day as listed on the prescription bottle.
- Medication shall be in original medication bottles which have legible writing on the pharmacy label. (Send only the amount of medication that is needed for the length of the event. The containers will be returned to the scout at the end of the event.)
- Put this form and the medications into a quart or gallon zip-lock baggie.
- The medications will be kept in a locked box. The Medic will distribute medications at all meals.
- Scouts needing medications at bedtime shall be responsible for arranging to meet with the Medic to get their medications at the appropriate time.
- Scouts are personally responsible to make sure that they get their medication at the correct time.
- Scouts shall get the medication back from the Medic at the same time as they get their Health form back when they leave the event.
